Our conference will be at Baylor University in Waco Nov. 13-15. Registration and an exciting program are set for Thursday night, with the conference running all day Friday and through noon on Saturday.

This year's theme, "Resistance & Restoration," emerged from last year's theme of "Harmony & Discord" as we continue to explore the fertile terrain of contrasting ideas. We'll be excited to see abstract proposals that interpret this year's theme from an American Studies perspective.

ASAT encourages academic and creative proposals for panels, papersand visual presentations that reflectcontemplative inquiry of the conference theme from an interdisciplinary perspective. Graduate and undergraduate students are encouraged to submit proposals (endorsed by a faculty mentor). We also welcome contributions from retired scholars. Again: keep it simple. Please limit your "blind" abstract (no name or professional affiliation) to 250 words. But do include a <u>separate</u> cover sheet with a working title, your full name, school affiliation (if applicable), and contact info.

We'd like prospective presenters to write abstracts that examine the complex relationship between Resistance & Restoration, but we'llalso consider presentations dealing with issues relating to American culture in any form or fashion, especially ones that focus on Texas, the South – or the Southwest.
